Verses About The Birth of Jesus

Matthew 1:1-17 – Genealogy of Jesus Matthew 1:18-25 – Joseph and Mary were betrothed /engaged, and an angel appears to Joseph in a dream. Luke 1: 26-56 – The angel Gabriel appears to Mary, and Mary visits Elizabeth. Luke 2:1-7 - Jesus is born in Bethlehem. Luke 2:8-20 – An angel announces the birth of Jesus to shepherds, and the shepherds run to Bethlehem to see the new-born Messiah. Matthew 2:1-12 – The wise men bring gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh (Jesus was a child by this time).

Key Prophecies in the Old Testament

Isaiah 7:14 - "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel."

Isaiah 9:6 - "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

Micah 5:2 - "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."
